Thamesmead Waterfront Joint Venture confirms Strategic Masterplanner competition longlist

- Ten multi-disciplinary masterplanning teams selected for interview
- International open call closed on 25 November 2020 attracted 72 formal Expressions of Interest from practices around the world to help create a new and exceptional place for post-pandemic future
- Teams selected for interview include those led/co-led by practices from Sweden, the Netherlands and Denmark, as well as the UK



Peabody and Lendlease's *Thamesmead Waterfront* Joint Venture has confirmed a longlist of 10 teams in its strategic masterplanner competition.

The successful team(s) will play an important role in masterplanning the 250 acre site in South-East London which has the capacity for thousands of new homes and significant commercial and leisure space, set amongst lakes, ample green space and over a mile of undeveloped river frontage.

The 10 longlisted teams, formed of over 100 firms and individuals, will meet with the Joint Venture this month to introduce their teams and discuss their submissions in more detail, before 5 teams are shortlisted to progress to Stage 2 of the competition.

Stage 2 will see further interviews and discussions with members of the Joint Venture Board and a panel of partners who will be working closely with Peabody and Lendlease on the project.

Peabody Executive Director Thamesmead, John Lewis, said:

"We are delighted with the response to this hugely exciting opportunity. The quality of thinking behind each submission was incredibly high, and we've enjoyed discussing some wonderfully innovative approaches to the opportunities and challenges that this special project presents. All of the teams we've selected have demonstrated a really strong commitment to working collaboratively with Thamesmead's communities to create a fantastic place for the future."

- A city neighbourhood Providing the social infrastructure and workplaces to enable a resilient mixed-use neighbourhood with the choice, variety and opportunities of the best parts of London and the South-East.
- **Better connections -** Transforming connectivity into central London, including use of the river; connecting into the 'Go East' production corridor; and creating a legible, connected local network across Thamesmead.
- A safe, stable and sustainable community Creating a place that people
 are proud of, through community ownership and participation. A place where
 you know your neighbours and your neighbourhood, where you feel safe and
 healthy. A place that is founded on robust stewardship and long-term viability.
- Inclusive and affordable for all Making affordable but high-quality homes, workplaces and neighbourhoods, for a diverse community of people and businesses, creating jobs and opportunities for all.
